It's been an exciting year as we move in to our new Theory of Change. We started out this year with an ambitious goal to serve 500 amazing young people. We are thrilled to report that thanks to the support of more than 311 caring mentors who donated over 25,000 volunteer hours, we ignited the power and potential of 516 young people. And what is even more incredible to see is the impact our programming has had. It is clear that Developmental Relationships have a large impact on the Social Emotional Competencies of kids in our community. Caring, supportive relationships are a critical intervention for young people facing adversity. It's evidence that mentoring relationships are not just nice, they are necessary.




